Snohomish County Recovery Act AmeriCorps program now accepting applications

June 5, 2009 - Everett, WA— Workforce Development Council Snohomish County is now accepting applications for the Snohomish County Recovery Act AmeriCorps Program. Members will serve their community for ten months while gaining skills and joining the National Service movement.

Recovery Act AmeriCorps Members will join one of two teams: the Sound Solutions team and the Energy Efficiency Team. Sound Solutions members will gain experience by connecting people to vital social services through the Snohomish County 2-1-1 system. Energy Efficiency members will lead a crew of youth in summer work projects and then work to connect people and agencies to weatherization and energy efficiency resources.

To qualify as a member, you must have been recently laid off, 18 years of age or older, have a high school diploma, able to pass a background check, and fulfill the application and interview process.

Benefits include: a modest living allowance, child care, student loan forbearance, training, work experience, health care, and an education award of \$4,725. The program begins in July, so apply online at www.wdcsc.org/amicorps.
